Noah was given instructions to prepare for something that nobody on Earth had ever seen, rain; much like we who live by faith live in a way and believe in something that nobody on Earth has ever seen or experienced, heaven. What's the logic or purpose in preparing or believing in something that technically hasn't been proven? Noah received God's instruction to build the ark and worked on it daily with no understanding or confirmation of what rain is, much like we who have received salvation and live a daily Christian life make a conscious daily decision to choose the will of God over our natural, fleshly urgings. Reflection Time
